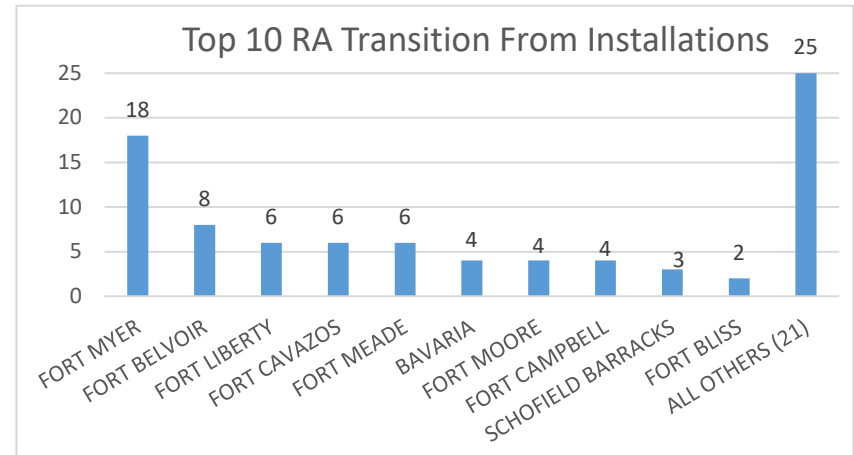
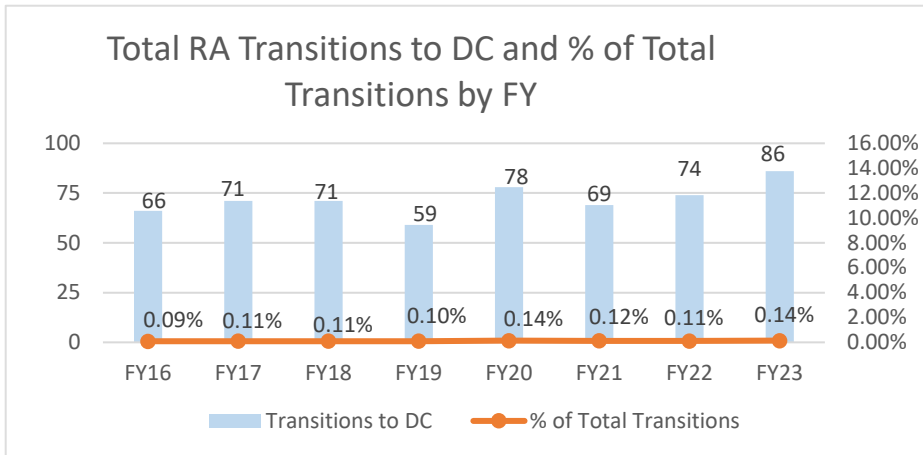

- ❖ **86 to DC**



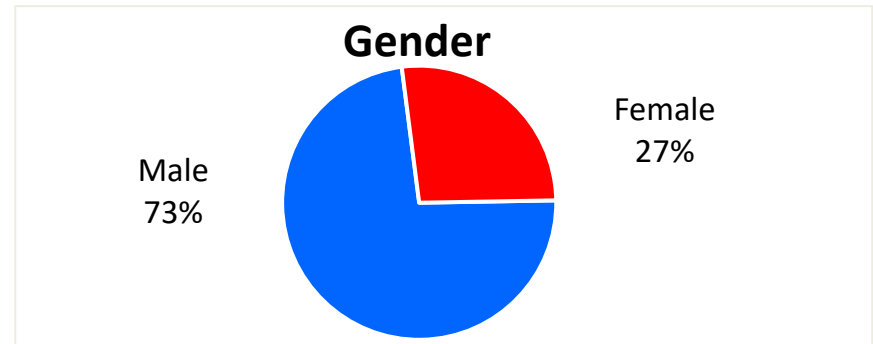
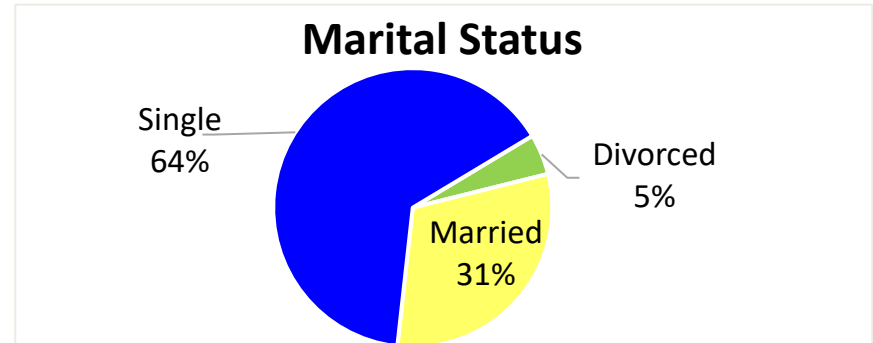
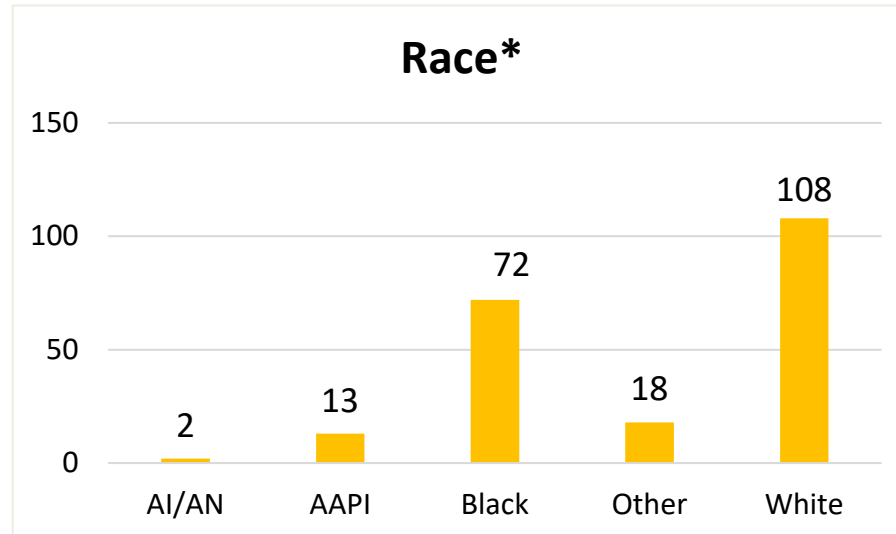
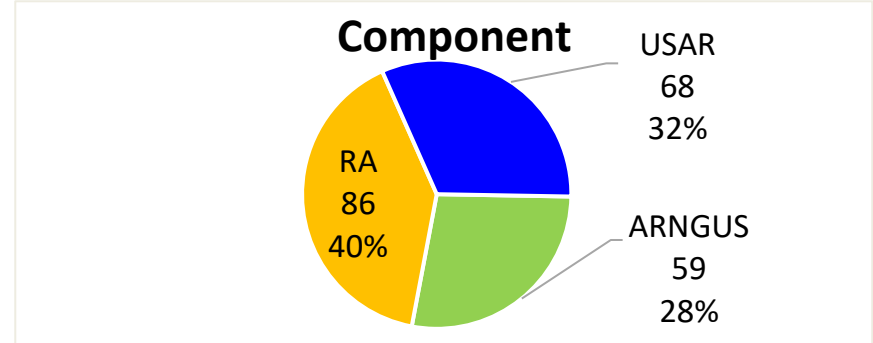
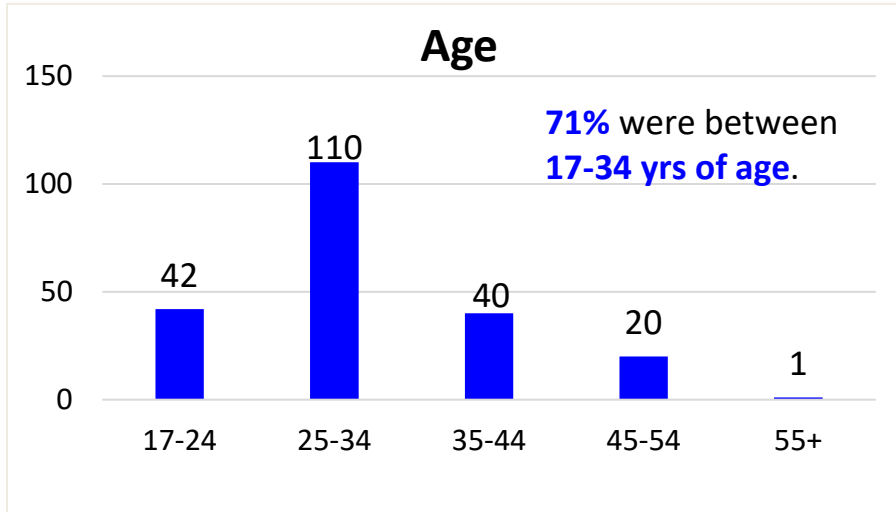

A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders (Census Bureau). **ALL** numbers are those with Honorable/general service.
