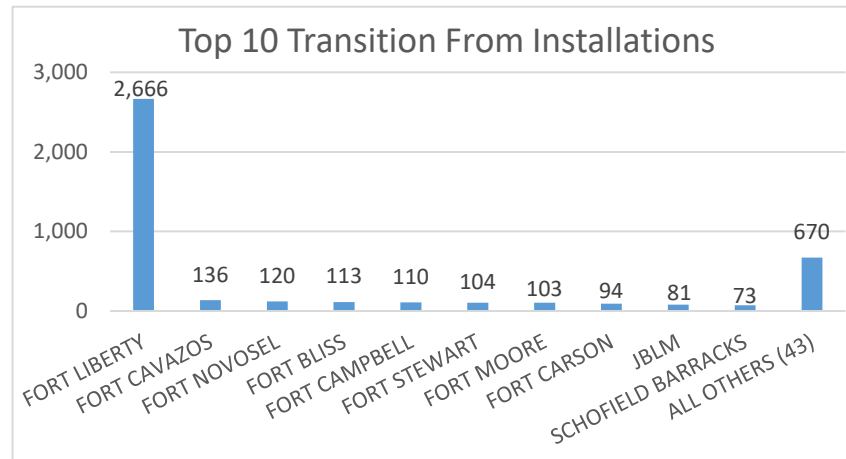
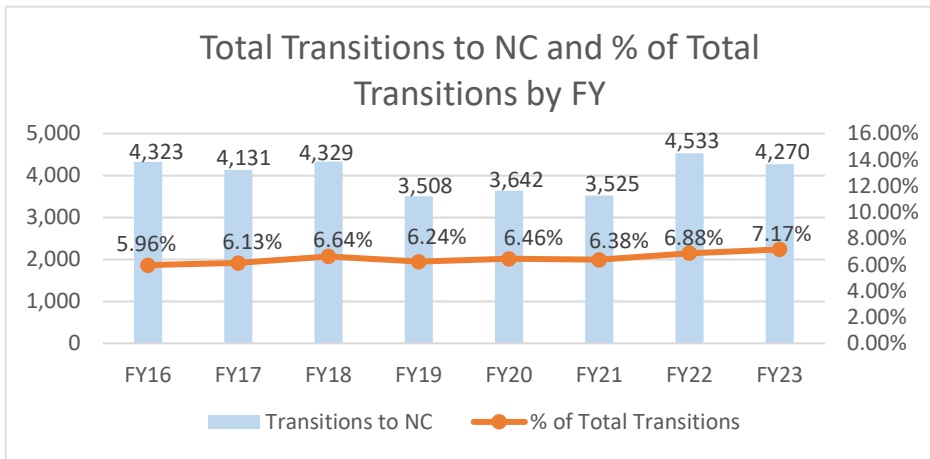


North Carolina ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in Regular Army (RA) soldier transitions. 7% (4,270) of the RA population for FY23 transitioned to North Carolina.

## NC FY23 RA Transitions

- **59,535** (left the Army)
- **2,605** (Joined in NC)
- **1,400** (returned to NC; **about 46% loss**)
- **2,870** (outsiders moved to NC)
- ❖ **4,270** to NC



\*MSA stands for Metropolitan Statistical Area. A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders (Census Bureau). Some MSAs split states however the numbers only reflect those that transitioned to NC. **ALL** numbers are those with Honorable/general service.  
 \*\* represents an installation at that MSA.

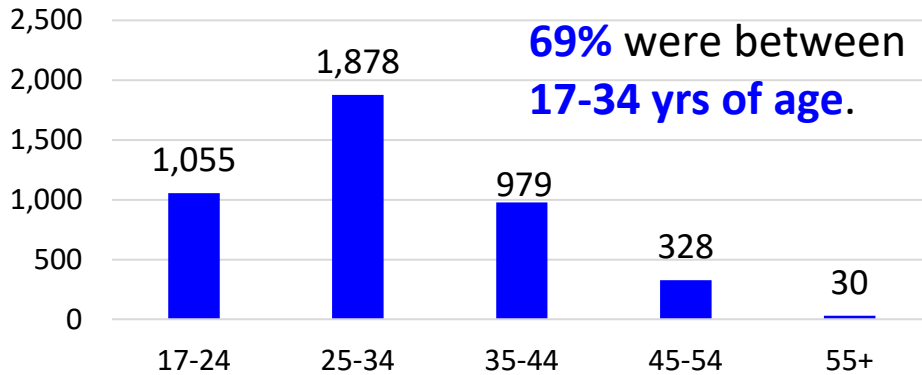

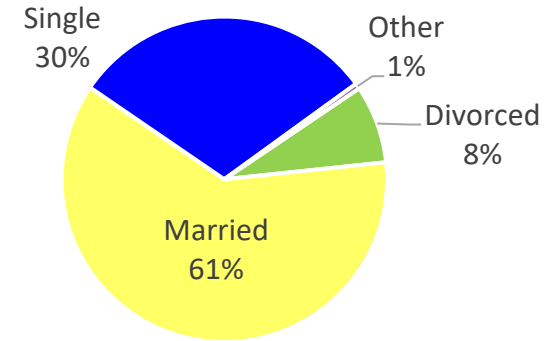


Demographics of the 4,270 RA soldiers that transitioned to North Carolina in FY23.

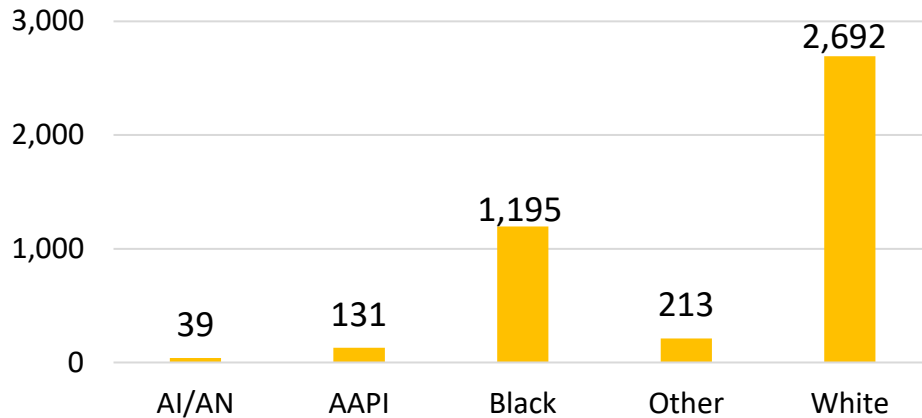
## Age



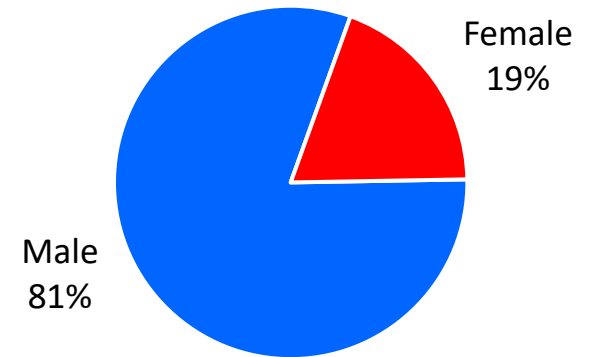
## Marital Status
